Yamada talk

Mariko Yamada, the former 4th District Assemblywoman was gracious in accepting Chithra's invitation to speak about her support of legislation beneficial to women and girls. She talked at our AAUW program on April 21st at the Blanchard Room.

The attendance was small, but Mariko spoke enthusiastically about care for the aged, where women make up the majority of those receiving care and those giving it. She tried to make the inspection of nursing homes more frequent. She said that complaints needed to be investigated more frequently and vigorously. But the Nursing Home owners are a big business and difficult to legislate against. Ms. Yamada also spoke a bit about the size and redrawing lines of Districts 3 and 4, and using a map, she showed where she hopes to be working next year (District 3).

Members attending were Verena and Ray, Estelle and Richard, Rhonda, Shahla, new member Laleh, Chithra, Nan, Gail, Juliana, and several former members. At the conclusion of her talk, the CEOs and Chithra presented Mariko with a certificate selecting her as Special Honoree for EOF (AAUW Educational Opportunity Funds). We donated money in her name. Three members of the public were also there for Mariko's presentation.
