Conversations with Mother (2004, Argentina/Spain, directed by Santiago Carlos Oves, 90 min.)

This Argentine drama/comedy gem is presented as an early Mother's Day offering, exploring the relationship between a mother in her eighties (portrayed by veteran actress China Zorilla) and her fifty-year old son Jaime (Eduardo Blanco) when the latter unexpectedly loses his job and faces a crisis in his heretofore comfortable middle class life. Pressured by his wife Dorita (Silvina Bosco) and his mother-in-law, Jaime visits his mother to tell her that she will have to give up her apartment, owned by Jaime and Dorita, so it can be sold to support the family. Mom refuses and eventually discloses her reason for the refusal, but not until mother and son spend countless hours in conversation. They reminisce about the past but also discuss the future and gradually Jaime comes to enjoy these conversations, becomes less depressed and realizes how the pressures of modern life have taken a toll on his family life and prevented him from really knowing his mother. Ulises Dumont as Gregorio, "anarchist-retired," adds the surprising element to the situation. This poignant story is told with humor and thoughtful dialog. The director is able to treat subjects like death, loneliness and personal crisis with a sense of optimism and hope, illustrating that love, tenderness and individualism far outweigh the material trappings of modern life. 2016-2017 FINANCIAL SUMMARY REPORT

At every board meeting, financial officer Gail Johnson gives an updated treasurer's report to the board. Members are always welcome to attend board meetings. At our annual meeting in April, a member asked about our financial status. Here is a quick summary of 2016-17 as of May 10. There will be activity until the close of the year on June 30. Unused funds are always carried forward.

OPERATING FUNDS: This fund is paid for with your dues. Branch business is carried out from this fund: Dues to AAUW, AAUW CA, insurance, assessments, our PO Box, printing and mailings etc. Balance \$985 AAUW FUNDS: These funds are sent to AAUW to fund our national scholarships, grants, legal advocacy fund and more. Members can donate at dues collection, through our fund drive in December, or anytime by credit card on the AAUW website. For 2016, members donated @\$2,300. These funds are tax deductible.

TECH TREK: This money is used to send four girls to the UC Davis Tech Trek each year. Funds are raised through member donations and quilt raffles. We would like to get businesses involved, as well. Currently, it costs \$900 a girl, so we need \$3,600 a year. For the 2017 camp, we raised \$4864! \$1264 is carried over to start the fund raising for the 2018 camp. These funds are tax deductible.

BRANCH PROJECTS: Members can donate to branch projects when dues are paid. Yard sale proceeds go in this fund. We use this fund for small donations to Sahaya Walks, Backpacks for kids, Women's History Month, and I House International Festival. Also, the annual meeting dinner comes from this fund as well as paying for the lunches of our trekkers and parents in June. Monies for conventions can also be designated. Balance \$2900. ANGEL FUND: Members donate at dues collection. Funds are used to pay memberships for any new or current member who needs financial assistance to join AAUW. This year it was not used, but has been in the past. Balance \$474.
