### INSTALLATION LUNCHEON

On June 10th we held our Installation of Officers Program at Season's Restaurant. She congratulated and welcomed the trekkers and recounted some of her experiences and how it sparked her interest in biomedical engineering. She also gave the girls an idea of what to expect at camp. She is looking forward to meeting them at camp this July.

Gail welcomed and congratulated all of them with a certificate and Tech Trek Bear. The 4 trekkers introduced themselves a bit more.

Next, Shahla spoke about her thoughts on women in leadership. She encouraged the girls to "be bossy!". She was told to be bossy as a girl, and it means you have leadership skills. She referenced a Public Policy Institute of CA (PPIC) video that celebrated 100 years since the first woman was elected to the CA State Assembly. She emphasized how women are still under represented in Congress, with women comprising 53% of the state's eligible voters, yet only make up 23% of the assembly. Shahla hopes that Tech Trek inspires these young women to be future leaders.

Rhonda then thanked the outgoing and welcomed the incoming board (they're all the same people!). All of the board members were presented with an Andean Cross she picked up in Peru. The three board members not present were Celida, Ramona and Laleh, and present board members were Verena, Leslie and Gail. She also recognized Marlene (our student liaison) and Stephany (student intern) and Juliana (not present, Spokeswoman extraordinaire), and finally her two fellow co-executive officers Shahla and Estelle. Gail honored the co-executives with Past Presidents pins (Rhonda inherited hers from her mother). They are extremely beautiful silver pins, that can be worn to any AAUW event to identify her as a past president.

Lastly, we said our farewell to Stephany, who's graduating from UCD with degrees in communications and economics. She received our branch bicycle pin, a "Give a Grad a Gift" membership to AAUW and a thank you note and gift card. Marlene presented her with an AAUW Cord to wear at graduation.
