Subject: 2019 Tech Trek Visit Day Gratitude

Hello AAUW Branch Members!

Just last week, the wildly successful Tech Trek inspired campers in STEM education on the UC Davis campus. It was a hot one, but no one melted down, and the energy was vibrant! Our Visit Day welcomed 33 members from 13 Northern California and Nevada branches and 33 visitors from Community invitations. The morning activity was spent observing and interacting with the girls at their core classes: dissecting sheep lungs (anatomy class), demonstrating solar powered skate boards (engineering class), preparing DNA models (genetics class), coloring mandalas they had drawn (3-D math/architecture class), lighting diodes from a motherboard (coding class.) There were many other projects completed and some of those had photos posted on the internal Facebook account, which members and families were allowed to access during the week. Many branch members stayed for the food court style lunch in the dining commons for \$14 each, and talked with the campers to get the highlights of their week. Their enthusiasm was dynamic!! I marvel at the maturity in thinking and ability to communicate that these girls demonstrated. One junior counselor told me that her experience was even more meaningful and enriching as a returning camper. These girls LOVE it!!

I hope all of you can attend a presentation when the girls thank YOU as sponsors. It is such a pivotal moment for these selected girls to stay on a university campus, have role models in STEM as their mentors/teachers in core classes and workshops, interact with highly intelligent women of integrity and motivation at the Professional Women's Evening, tour campus facilities such as the Vet Med Hospital and State Pathology centers, the Mondavi Performing Arts and Shrem Art gallery. Some of the branch members survived the heat and toured the Mondavi and Shrem (these have a/c) and made a full day of it. I encourage all of us to go at least once, and go again and again, to see what an amazing camp we have developed. Since its beginning at Stanford campus in 1998, the other multiple sites in California and spreading throughout the U.S. and the first Davis Tech Trek in 2011, thousands of girls have been instructed, encouraged and shown how their dreams can be fulfilled. We AAUW members make it happen with our financial support! THANK YOU for your continued advocacy to promote STEM exploration and give girls a glimpse of what is possible for their lives.
